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Dear Parents and Students



This will be the final newsletter for Term 1. I would like to thank students, staff and parents for their support in once again making this a very positive term. Despite the heat and then the rain we have had a great start to the year. Don't forget there are now two weeks of holidays over the Easter break beginning on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April with students returning to school on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> April. (Easter is at the end of the holiday break this year.) Our school Anzac Day and Induction Ceremony will be held on Friday 21st April at 10.15 am and we invite parents and community members to share this event with our staff and students.

Interim Reports for Term 1 will not be posted to you until the end of Week 1 in Term 2. This will allow teachers a little more time to observe how students are progressing. These reports are to give you feedback on how your child is progressing at this point in the semester and allows us to work with you and your student should there be a need to intervene around improvement strategies. Please also check days absent on the report.

At this stage we will be holding formal Parent-Teacher Interviews on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May from 3.15pm and I would encourage all parents to attend if possible. This year, as we have had quite a number of new staff we will run a sausage sizzle on the night and invite parents to come and meet your child's teachers as well as discussing progress. More information will be provided around this event at the beginning of Term 2 with Report Cards.

In the last week of this term and Week 1 of Term 2 all of our Year 11 students will begin VET training on a Certificate 2 level course. Participation is mandatory and is regarded as part of the student's course of study for their QCE and every Year 11 student will be taking part. It is not okay to stay away this week in the lead up to the holidays and it is important to be back on the first day of the next term as the course will continue then. For our Year 12 students these weeks will offer an opportunity for teachers to spend dedicated time to work with Year 12 students to go over any work not understood, to offer some more individualised assistance and to begin work for Term 2 units. Please do not allow students to stay at home – there will be important teaching that occurs during this time.

Just a reminder about attendance and school results. Attendance is a key factor in success at school. Our goal this year is to have all year levels at 90% or above attendance rate. At present the Attendance Rates are –

Week 9 and it only feels like yesterday that we started the first term of 2017. At the start of the year parents and students were frantically handing in laptop forms with a \$100 payment to secure a new take-home laptop. I am pleased to say that after doubling our initial order we are three laptops away from placing 100 new laptops into student's hands and your homes. We are now onto our second stage of rolling out the at school laptops which will allow students to borrow out laptops in the morning and hand them in of an afternoon. All of our year 7 and 8 students will have access to these laptops by the end of term. In term 2 we will investigate ways to roll this program out in years 9 and 10 meaning a 1 to 1 laptop program for the entire high school. Our next challenge will be working together to best use this technology in every class, every day. Rosedale State School is leading the way with this current program.



Week 10 Term 1 and Week 1 Term 2 will bring the start to the year 11 VET program with all year 11 students involved in a Certificate II course which will be completed by the end of the year. The only cost to parents will be the PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) which will only be necessary for the Resource Infrastructure course. If you have the required equipment at home there is no need to purchase this through the school. If you don't already have this equipment it is a good deal to acquire this through the program. Once again I will emphasise the need for students to be at school every day for the entire program to complete the course in full. If your student is away for medical reasons a medical certificate will be required.

Year 12 students will enjoy two weeks with their respective teachers in all classes. This will allow two weeks to complete assessment and provide individualised support for our students in their final year of schooling. These weeks are school weeks not part of the holiday period, attendance is a must. Everyday counts.

At the end of week 10 there will be two weeks break. This will allow time for the students to reflect on the term that was and refresh for the term to come. Please enjoy the holiday break with your children. If you are travelling stay safe, If you are staying home relax and I look forward to seeing everyone back here happy and well for Term 2.

**2017 World Dwarf Games**



Sean is very excited to have been selected as a team member for the 2017 Australian Team competing at the World Dwarf Games. He will be wearing the green and gold and **representing Australia in basketball, soccer and athletics.**

The World Dwarf Games are held once every four years. This year the games will be held in Guelph, Ontario, Canada between 5–12 August 2017 with approximately 40 Australia athletes competing. These games are expected to be the largest sporting event in history exclusively for athletes with dwarfism. Over 500 elite athletes from all corners of the globe set to compete. ### After School Sport

**Prep / 1 / 2** In Science this term the P/1/2 class has been learning about the needs of living things, what makes a healthy habitat and how living things grow and change. As part of this unit we provided a healthy habitat for some chicks in our classroom. We collected data and compared the weight and



height of 3 chicks from 2 days of age until they were 4 weeks old. In addition to this we planted 3 different types of seeds (sunflowers, peas and beans) and made observations as they grew. During the term we also incubated some chicken eggs and got to see how the chick embryos grew and developed inside of the egg with a process called Candling. Last Sunday we were lucky enough to have 6 healthy chicks hatch!

## Maths Challenge

On Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March, students from years 4,5,6,7 & 8 travelled to Agnes to participate in a maths challenge. This is part one of the Tetra-Olympiad for the schools in our region. Other schools such as Miriam Vale, Wartburg, Agnes and Discovery College also attended.

We participated in 4 rounds of the competition. We had to complete two individual rounds where we had a short time to answer 20 verbal questions. The other two rounds were group problem solving rounds where we could work together as a group to answer as many questions as we could in a certain time frame to try and earn the most points.

While we didn't win on the day it was a great experience for us all to practise our problem solving, mental computation skills and group work.

On the way home we were able to stop at Café Discovery at Agnes Waters. We were served some very lovely food by some happy, speedy staff members. It was a great experience for us all.
