

AIP - Every year schools develop an AIP (Annual Implementation Plan) that outlines what the school is focussing on for the year. This year we are focussing on building **Engagement** & **Curriculum** knowledge. You may have noticed the new logo that will be on most of our school documents this year. In the primary this means building ENGAGEMENT – by improving attendance rates, focusing on social and emotional wellbeing (through The Resilience Project), creating more



learning time and creating engaging activities. We will be building our CURRICULUM knowledge in preparation of the Version 9 updated curriculum to be delivered next year as well as a more consistent approach to literacy (through PLD).

The Resilience Project – is an emotionally engaging program using evidence based, practical wellbeing strategies to build resilience. As part of this program, students were given journals to help teach positive mental health strategies to become happier and more resilient.

PLD – This year we are introducing a new literacy program in the primary school to enhance students' literacy skills. PLD is a program that incorporates knowledge from the education sector as well as Speech Therapists and Occupational Therapists.

Homework – Homework is designed to build good study habits and be a continuation of the students are currently doing in class. It is not meant to be difficult and should be fairly independent. Homework for this year across the primary will include aspects of PLD that students have learnt throughout the week. They will be segmenting their spelling words and reading dictation passages (for enhanced decoding and fluency). Along with PLD homework, students may be set some maths questions or other optional activities.

Leadership Induction – Last year we elected our primary student leadership team. Our 2023 School Captains are Charlotte & Malachi. Our House Captains are Clare (O'Neill), Alicia (Slater) & Xzavier (Thorpe). Last week the student leaders attended the Grip Leadership Conference in Bundaberg where they learnt leadership skills. These students (along with some other to be elected students) will make up our student council and be presented with their leadership badges next week at the Investiture Ceremony.

This year, I am very excited to take on the role of Head of Senior Schooling. While this role is new for me, I have been teaching at Rosedale for the past three years. I am passionate about providing a range of options for students as they prepare for their future. Prior to becoming a teacher, I was a business owner and TAFE teacher. I am also a highly accomplished teacher, so I have a broad understanding of working life. I understand this role will have many challenges and I will need a strong solution focus.

There are many intricate rules around Senior Schooling, and we are always working hard to set students up for a strong future, whatever that may hold. So please do not hesitate to contact me about your child's progress.



In the senior schooling space, we are working on students becoming more resilient by managing their time better and compiling their gratitude journals. Research by Better Health has shown most teens only receive an average of 7 hours of sleep. However, it is recommended that teens get 10 hours of sleep a night. Sleep plays a crucial role in learning and memory consolidation. During sleep, the brain processes and integrates new information and experiences from the day, which helps to solidify memories and enhance learning. Lack of sleep can impair cognitive function, including attention, concentration, and problem-solving skills, making it harder to learn and retain new information. Therefore, getting adequate, quality sleep is essential for optimal learning and academic performance.

This term will see the start of joint school-TAFE courses in a range of areas. The Senior Schooling area has also been working on a number of joint projects to give students real-world skills for their future employment.

How you can help your child:

- Check the assessment calendar to see what assessments are coming each week
- Help your child maximise their attendance. Every day counts!
- Help support them in organising themselves to ensure they come to school ready to learn. This requires:
 - A Clean uniform
 - Enough food to keep them fuelled up for the day (or money for tuckshop)
 - Plenty of sleep

These little things may seem trivial, but they add up to Senior Schooling success. Adolescents often look all grown up but struggle with organisation and need some support, as well as needing more sleep for their considerable growth.

I look forward to a fantastic year and continuing to build on the strong foundation we have at Rosedale State School.

Welcome back to 2023.

The Department of Education has released a new resource allocation model for students with disability, replacing the Education Adjustment Program (EAP).

The Students with disability – Reasonable adjustments resourcing (RAR) model provides additional teachers and teacher aides to help schools make reasonable adjustments for students with disability.

I'm pleased to say RAR provides resources for all disabilities including autism, intellectual disability, vision, hearing and physical impairments as well as dyslexia, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and mental health conditions — based on the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability adjustment levels. This means we can receive support for students who may not have been recognised under the EAP.

RAR will also provide additional teachers and teacher aides for anticipated adjustments for Prep and other new students at our school, so students will get earlier support if they have a diagnosed disability.

Here at Rosedale, the support staff consist of Head of Special Education Services - Debra Flesser (myself); 2 support teachers – Stephanie Smith (Primary support) and Pam Smith (Junior Secondary support) and a number of experienced teacher aides. We are based in J Block.

The support teachers and teacher aides work with students and teachers across the school with academic and engagement, social emotional concerns, as well as sensory needs.

If you have any concerns with your child please feel free to contact the school.



Hi Rosedale Families

My name is Linda Pappalardo and I have returned to Rosedale as your Guidance Officer. I have three main ways of supporting students in our school:

- 1. Educational Counselling developing ways to support students who find their school work too hard or too easy.
- 2. Personal Counselling developing ways to support students who have things going on either at school or out of school, that are interfering with their learning
- 3. Career Counselling exploring pathways to tertiary education or employment at the completion of secondary schooling.



Students are referred to the Guidance Officer in one of the following ways:

- 1. Teachers identify students who need support and refer to the Inclusion Team, of which I am a member.
- 2. Students can self-refer, by requesting an appointment through the school office.
- 3. The Principal and /or Deputy Principals can refer students directly.
- 4. Families can discuss concerns and/or request a referral through the school Administration.

School Immunisation Program

Ozcare is providing free vaccinations for all Year 7 and Year 10 students, on Thursday 30 March 2023, as part of Queensland Health's annual School Immunisation Program. All Year 7 and Year 10 students are being offered free vaccinations as recommended on the National Immunisation Program to protect against vaccine preventable diseases. Year 7 students will be offered human papillomavirus (HPV) and diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (whooping cough) vaccination. Year 10 students will be offered meningococcal ACWY vaccination.

Any students in Years 8 and 11 who missed out last year can also participate in the upcoming Immunisation Clinic, please contact Ozcare on 4130 8900.

The vaccinations will be conducted by a team of authorised registered nurses.

Textiles Studies Year 8


